BOARD-DECLARED VACANCY CAUSED BY ABSENTEEISM

NEPN/NSBA Code: BBBDA

When a member must be absent from a regular meeting, that member shall inform the Board Chair (or the Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable) that she/he will not attend the meeting. The minutes of the meeting shall reflect the attendance status of all members.

- 1. Should a member have two consecutive, non-reported, absences or three consecutive reported absences and following attempts by the Chair to ascertain the member's status and intention, the member shall be informed that a subsequent absence will cause the Board to declare the seat open.
- 2. At its next regular meeting, and having informed the member who has been absent, the Board shall meet in executive session to discuss declaring a Board vacancy. The member in question will be notified of the meeting so that she/he can attend and that member shall be provided the opportunity to present his/her reasons why the Board should not declare a vacancy.
- 4. Following the deliberation, the Board may meet in open session to vote whether or not to declare a vacancy.
- 5. Should a vacancy be declared in accordance with this policy, the vacancy will be filled in accordance with the appropriate provisions of M.R.S.A. Title 20-A.
- 6. An absence for any of the following reasons shall be routinely considered and excused absence: Illness of the member or members of his/her immediate family, death in the member's family, a short-term family obligation, or an unavoidable commitment related to the member's employment (so long as such commitment is not of the type which prevents the member from attending on a regular basis). Absences for reasons other than those identified above shall be considered by the Board on an individual basis.
